## **From the Pastor**

Perhaps, compared to the winters of our memories, the winter just past might not seem to have been that fierce. But I still remember with a shiver those days when we had those frigid temperatures. And I remember the couple of times when church was called off because of the snow. There were several days when I found myself thinking, "I've had about enough of winter," when I started longing for spring to come. But this month and next month, one thing will be sure: spring will spring. It's finally here: the gently lengthening days, the return of green on the tips of the trees and on the lawns in our neighborhoods. Soon you'll be able to smell it on the air: tree blossoms and good, rich soil.

We're lucky to be living in a place where the new life that is just getting started outside also reflects the new life we're celebrating as a church. For Easter belongs in the spring, when there is something new in the air, when life returns, when even sorrow becomes cast in a new light and becomes radiant.

It reminds me of that verse from the book of Revelation, a verse we hear, more often than not, at funerals. (Revelation 21:5) And we might notice how that is phrased. All things. Not just a few. Not only the holiest, the most faithful, but all things.

And so we can't help but celebrate once again. So please enjoy it! Wear something "springy" to church this month. Have a chocolate Easter egg. Take a moment to appreciate the sights and the smells of this season. But most of all, let the "Alleluias" ring out robustly.

# "STOP GIVING - We Have More Than Enough": Unpacking the craziest fundraising story in the Bible Part 4

Exodus 35:21-31 And they came, everyone whose heart was stirred, and everyone whose spirit was willing, and brought the LORD'S offering to be used for the tent of meeting, and for all its service, and for the sacred vestments. So they came, both men and women; all who were of a willing heart brought brooches and earrings and signet rings and pendants, all sorts of gold objects, everyone bringing an offering of gold to the LORD. And everyone who possessed blue or purple or crimson yarn or fine linen or goats' hair or tanned rams' skins or fine leather, brought them. Everyone who could make an offering of silver or bronze brought it as the LORD's offering; and everyone who possessed acacia wood of any use in the work, brought it. All the skillful women spun with their hands, and brought what they had spun in blue and purple and crimson yarns and fine linen; all the women whose hearts moved them to use their skill spun the goats' hair. And the leaders brought onyx stones and gems to be set in the ephod and the breastpiece, and spices and oil for the light, and for the anointing oil, and for the fragrant incense. All the Israelite men and women whose hearts made them willing to bring anything for the work that the LORD had commanded by Moses to be done, brought it as a freewill offering to the LORD.
