From the Pastor

These are good days to go barefoot when you can.

To allow your poor feet the chance to escape the confines of socks and shoes and just breathe for awhile. To maybe let the grass outside tickle your toes, or to rest your soles against the cool, tiled floor in your house.

But, admittedly, going barefoot isn't always where it's at. If you've ever had to cross a sidewalk or a driveway in your bare feet on a blazing August afternoon, or walk across a gravel or rock walkway in your bare feet—then you already know that your feet are going to be poor for a different reason entirely. Sometimes the ground is too hot, or too sharp to walk on, and that's when an old pair of sneakers, or flip-flops, or sandals can sound like a pretty good idea.

At the end of this month, we'll be sharing the story of Peter's confession from Matthew's gospel. And, if you remember that story, you might also remember that it's the reason Peter ends up with his name in the first place. Jesus calls Peter "the Rock," many, many years before Dwayne Johnson, thus changing his name from Simon to Peter.

And yet, it's not just Peter in himself that's so rock-like—it's his faith. It's Peter's faith that leads him to voice the confession that Jesus is "the Messiah, the Son of the living God." It's this kind of faith that Jesus recognizes as a bedrock on which to build the church.

But the very next week, at the first of next month, we'll share the follow-up story, where Peter doesn't want to hear that Jesus is going to have to suffer and die, and where the Rock suddenly becomes a potential stumbling block for Jesus.

I'm sure that you share my desire to have a rock-like faith—something that's good and solid to stand upon, that won't let us down even when we're going through tough times. But at the same time, even a rock-like faith needs to not only be rooted in God's grace, but also to grow, to be open to God's ever-moving, ever-flowing grace. God's grace can take us places where we never thought we'd go and give us new eyes to see those around us and life itself.

Otherwise, we're going to end up being more like that hot sidewalk, or that path full of jagged rocks—very uncomfortable to walk on when you're barefoot!

My prayer for all of us is to have the kind of faith we can build on—but not one that will become a stumbling block.
