Hebron WELCA met on Thursday Nov. 16, at the home of Nancy Hanson. Those attending were Delores Fisher, Nancy Hanson, Gloria Martin, and Carol Riffel. Carol opened with devotion "Come & Follow Me".

Carol presented the bible study "Holy Places – Pilgrimage – the journeys we take to a holy place or for a holy purpose, and the promise that God meets us along the way ". We are looking for the places where we can be assured of finding Jesus and feeling his presence with us. Pilgrimage is grounded in our relationships to other people. Jesus tells us to trust that in going where he sends us, he will be with us and we will find what we need.

Carol read the minutes of the last meeting and Delores shared the treasurer's report. She sent \$150 to Central States Synod WELCA. We served drinks, cake & cookies after the burial at Hebron cemetery for Jean Ecklund on Sat. Nov. 11.

Gloria reminded everyone of our plans for the Advent/Christmas season. We will decorate the church on Sun. Nov. 26, after worship. A pizza lunch will be provided by Thrivent. We all volunteered to make dessert. We will donate clothing, school supplies, and monetary gifts to the Centre Schools before Christmas. We will remember our shut-ins Naomi, Roger, Jewell, Hallie, and Maxine with a plate of cookies. Pizza Hut gift cards will be given to our college students Jensen and Kyle. A Christmas gift will be purchased for Pastor and his family. Carol is in charge of getting the Poinsettias.

We made our hostess schedule for 2024 and talked about Altar Guild.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting will be Jan. 18, 2:00 PM at the home of Gloria Martin. Gloria will lead the Bible Study. **Hebron Church Council** met on Mon. Nov. 20, 2023, in the church basement. Those present were Andy Carlson, Connie Johnson, Amber Peterson, Tana Riffel, Tom Remy, and Pastor Peters.

Meeting opened with a prayer led by Pastor Peters. Secretary minutes were read by Amber and approved.

Pastor Peters gave his Pastoral report of communion calls/visits, hospital visits, and the baptism at Hebron for Kendall Coleman. He thanked the church for the approval and response for the prayers for healing and thanked everyone for attending the meeting with Pastor Peter Rehwaldt concerning the Pastoral call. Pastor shared his schedule for the week of Christmas.

Connie shared the treasurer's report. As of Nov. 2023, \$18,000 has been deposited to the Good Neighbor Parish for the year. A letter was received from the insurance company stating a 1% increase for wind and hail damage.

Council decided that Hebron will not have worship service on Sunday, Dec. 24. Christmas morning Julotta service will be Monday, Dec. 25, at 7:00 AM.

Christmas Tree/Church Decorating will be Sun. Nov. 26th after worship. Phil & Jamie Peterson will get the live tree for the church.

Hebron will again donate \$500 each to Dickinson County Family Resource Exchange, Marion County Food Bank and Morris County Care and Share.

There was discussion about getting a second headset microphone. Council is still waiting on a second bid on replacing the window damaged at the parsonage.

Connie stated that all the old tables and chairs have been delivered to Pilsen Packrats and the basement class room looks much better. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting Jan. 15, 2024 at 7:00 PM.

From the Pastor

I have fond memories from my childhood of winter evenings in my parents' home. On some evenings, my Dad would build a fire in the fireplace that was in our living room. Then, after dinner, we would gather around that fire. Sometimes, we would just watch the flames. Sometimes, we would talk. And sometimes, there would be stories.

Sometimes, those stories would take the form of what I call a "continuing story." The way it worked was very simple. One person would begin the story, and then stop. Then the next person would pick up the threads of that story and continue it. The story would pass from person to person, always growing along the way. You could never tell what was going to happen or what crazy characters or family members might turn up as a part of the story. I remember that there was always a lot of laughter as the stories started to veer off course, going off in unexpected directions. After the story had made a couple of rounds around the room, someone would bring it to a conclusion.

For years, I have enjoyed the thought of the season of Advent as a season of stories. We come in from the cold on these Sunday December mornings, and we tell stories. Wondrous stories that help us to look forward to the coming of Christmas and the coming of the Savior at the end of time. Stories that speak to us about God coming to be with us, of God among us, of the fullness of grace and truth living in our very midst. In the midst of hard times, hope is proclaimed, and the peace of God comes in unexpected images like the wolf and the lamb eating together and the lion eating straw like an ox (Isaiah 11).

You might think that these stories aren't really like the continuing stories I described above at all, because they've all been written down in a book. But every year, these same stories speak to us in new ways, if only we open our eyes and ears and hearts to them. And when you do that, you can never tell what will happen. For God's word is active and alive among us, and it always stretches us in ways that we don't expect.

This December, on Sunday mornings, I'd like to invite you to come in from the cold and share these stories with us. And when you do, to open your heart to them and allow them to reach into your life like never before. And then, come Christmas Eve and Christmas morning, to allow the stories of those times to do the same thing.

Elie Wiesel famously once wrote, "God made man because God loves stories." For me, that means that God must love this time of the year as much as we do. Because God wants us to keep telling the stories.

I wish you a joyous holiday that is full of good stories—family stories told around the fire, but also the wonderful stories we will share from the scriptures. Let God's continuing story touch your heart and fill this season with his light.

If you'd like to make your Advent extra special, consider putting a little Advent into every day of this season! Below are scripture readings for every day of Advent. Find a comfortable spot, pull out your Bible and you're ready to go! Most of the readings are short, so read them slowly and give yourself some time for the words to sink in.

I've also given you all the "O Antiphons," from which the familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" was written. The church has used these antiphons for centuries to announce that Christmas is getting close! So, starting December 17th, you might consider using them yourself!

Finally, you might choose to close your time of reading and reflection by saying the Lord's Prayer, or by reading one of the Advent prayers that I've included.

Minutes of the St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Meeting

10/17/2023

President Dan Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:22 pm.

The meeting was opened with devotions provided by Dede.

The minutes of the 09/26/2023 council meeting were read. Karen motioned for approval; Jennifer seconded. The minutes were approved as written.

Financials – Debbie discussed the financial reports as of 09/30/2023. Plan selection for Portico insurance was due and the gold plan was selected. While personnel expenses appear over budget, the medical and dental expenses are down. Mileage expenses are also under budget. Contract labor is high due to supply pastors and worship supplies expenses are over budget. The church has not incurred any expenses to date for Pastor Rehwaldt's consulting services.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Peters thanked the congregations for allowing him to provide the prayers for healing on October 15. Pastor will hold confirmation class on October 22 following the semi-annual meeting. Pastor Peters asked about involvement in Trunk or Treat, but Dan said he has it covered. Discussion was held regarding whether Sunday morning services should be held in addition to the Christmas Eve services. Pastor Peters will inquire of Hebron council to consider their preference. A "friendsgiving" meal will be arranged for November 19 to precede the meeting with Pastor Rehwaldt.

Unfinished Business

Carpet/Tile Cleaning – Julie contacted I-serve. The floors were measured. The east entrance has rust stains that cannot be removed and damaged tiles; therefore, replacement was recommended. No estimate has been provided yet.

Parsonage Furniture Needs – There might be a solution for an end table for use in the bedroom and for dining room chairs.

New Business

Semi-Annual Meeting – The semi-annual meeting is scheduled for October 22, 2023. Discussion regarding nominees for the open church council position was held.

Budget Meeting – Discussion was held regarding reducing the budget for 2024.

Trunk or Treat – Dan will manage distributing the treats on October 28, 2023.

Pilgrimage of Lights – The Pilgrimage is scheduled for December 3, 2023. Saint Paul will sponsor the wise men scene and needs volunteers for actors. Karen is also looking for a device to play music and narration.

Sound Booth Issues – Internet was unable to connect to stream the services on October 15. Dale has contacted McClellan Sound from Wichita to resolve the issue.

Other Items – Community-wide meal is being researched by Corkie for the hospital workers that no longer have positions. More details on this meal will follow.

The next meeting will be November 21, 2023 at 6:15 PM. Julie will provide devotions.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
