Hebron Church Council met Mon. Sept. 18, 2023, with board members Andy Carlson, Connie Johnson, Tana Riffel, Amber Peterson, and Pastor Jim Peters in attendance.

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the July meeting were read by Amber and approved.

Pastor presented his report. He stated he has enjoyed the special events and celebrations of Labor Day worship at Burdick and God's Work Our Hands at St Paul. He thanked the congregation for attending the workshops with Pastor Rehwaldt. He provided dates for upcoming events: Kendall Coleman baptism and Blessing of animals on Oct. 1, and prayers for healing on Oct. 15.

Connie shared the treasurer's report.

There was discussion on the broken window at the parsonage. There is a \$2500 deductible. Will get bids to replace the glass before making the decision of turning in a claim to insurance.

Transition update – next workshop with Pastor Rehwaldt is Nov. 19, at St Paul.

Connie read a very heartfelt Thank You from Deb Wiles for the use of the church and refreshments after Stan's burial at Hebron.

A letter from the Synod was read asking for an increase in our giving to Synod. It was agreed to have the budget committee consider this for next year.

Pilsen Packrats will buy the 6 remaining old tables and take the chairs to sell at

their auction for the church. Connie is asking for help getting the tables and chairs to their auction site in Hillsboro.

Bishop's On-line engagement was held VIA Zoom on September 19. We met at St. Paul in the fellowship hall. 10 people attended. We had nachos or chips and cheese and strawberry strudel bites for dessert. Bishop shared facts about the ELCA and their vision for the future church.

As we find ourselves at home in God's love, we also love and serve our neighbors – so that together we can share the earth that is home to us all.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

From the Pastor

I believe in the power of prayer.

Coming from a pastor, I guess that should come as no surprise. But it makes a difference to me that you're aware of this as I tell you about something I plan to offer you this month.

On Sunday, October 15, I'll be offering prayers for healing during worship at both churches. Around the middle of the service, you'll be invited, if you wish, to come forward and request specific prayers for yourself, or for someone else if that's what you would prefer. The microphone will be off and our musicians will be quietly playing in the background, so you don't have to worry about everyone hearing your request. You can also simply request a general prayer for healing and good health. Once you've done that, I'll lay a hand on your head and pray for you, and finish by anointing you with oil. By anointing I mean that I'll trace the sign of the cross on your forehead with some blessed oil.

I've made a practice of doing this every October for years and years. I don't promise any miracle cures, but on several occasions people have told me that the prayers have helped them. And, of course, any help that comes is not from me, but from the Lord. But even if nothing at all seems to happen, I still believe it's important that we pray for one another, and being held in prayer so personally and intensely is always a good thing.

I do this because I'm convinced that God wants to help us.

It's not God's will for us that we should suffer or walk around in constant pain. And when things are difficult for us, I believe that God helps us carry our burdens.

Jesus himself prayed for those who were ill or injured, often healing and restoring them in the process. And that's a big reason why I think it's wise to continue this practice. Above all, he knows what we're going through and I'm sure that he wants to help us. We can rely on his compassion. The fifth chapter of the epistle of James also speaks about the importance of praying for the sick, and for anointing them with oil.

I realize that this might seem a little strange to you and you may be hesitant to come forward. And if no one comes forward for prayers that day, I promise you that I'll be okay with it. You'll still hear from me about God's healing in the day's sermon, and the prayers that day will be a litany of prayers for healing. The sermon that day will be about half the length of what you usually get from me, to give us just a little more time for prayer.

I wanted to let you know about this in advance, so you won't be caught off guard on that particular Sunday. Please consider letting me pray for you that day. But even if you don't, know that you are still held in care by our loving God.

We'll also get to celebrate Reformation Sunday together at the end of this month, and that will be a blessing, too. God bless you and keep you this October, and always!


